We need your help to plant hundreds of plants along the Fremont Cut of Lake Washington Ship Canal. Two volunteer days will be held on either side of Fremont Cut:

Friday, November 19

Location: In front of the dinosaur statue on the Burke-Gilman Trail in Fremont

Saturday, November 20

10 a.m. - 2 p.m.

Location: Along the South Ship Canal Trail (Queen Anne/Magnolia), in front of the Seattle Pacific University track

The volunteer days are part of phase two of the Corps of Engineers four-phased plan to restore the aging poplar colonnade along Fremont Cut in a historically appropriate manner. Phase two included removing 29 poplar trees and planting 40 in spring 2010. The Corps is replanting the historic understory this fall.

The Corps operates the Lake Washington Ship Canal, including the Fremont and Montlake Cuts and the Chittenden Locks in Ballard. The Lake Washington Ship Canal Historic District is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and must be maintained according to federal preservation standards.
